4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Eye If in eyes, hold eyelids apart and flush continuously with running water. Continue

flushing until advised to stop by a Poisons Information Centre, a doctor, or for at

least 15 minutes.

breathing.

7. STORAGE AND HANDLING

Storage Store in a cool, dry, well ventilated area, removed from oxidising agents, acids,

alkalis, heat or ignition sources and foodstuffs. Ensure containers are adequately labelled, protected from physical damage and sealed when not in use. Check regularly for leaks or spills. Large storage areas should have appropriate fire

protection systems. Store as a Class C2 Combustible Liquid (AS1940).

Handling Before use carefully read the product label. Use of safe work practices are

recommended to avoid eye or skin contact and inhalation. Observe good personal hygiene, including washing hands before eating. Prohibit eating, drinking and

smoking in contaminated areas.

CLEANING MINERAL OIL CONTAMINATED CLOTHING; Cleaners are advised that when cleaning oil contaminated clothing it is essential that freshly distilled solvent is used for each batch, including final rinse, as even filtered solvent will leave oil residues.

MINERAL OILS - INJECTION; Where high pressure applications are used the risk of accidental injection under the skin exists and may result in an extremely painful and serious injury requiring immediate medical attention.
